Quicksilver Resources Helps Children Heading Back to School

TARRANT COUNTY – Communities In Schools of Greater Tarrant County (CIS), a stay-in-school and dropout prevention nonprofit, received a generous donation of school supplies from Quicksilver Resources, the Fort Worth-based independent oil and gas company.

Communities In Schools, the largest employer of social workers in Tarrant County, places dedicated social workers directly inside local schools to connect at-risk students with individualized resources.
